



Fines

The amount of the fine the court assesses is determined only by the facts and circumstances of the case. Mitigating circumstances may lower the fine even if you are found guilty. On the other hand, aggravating circumstances may increase the fine. In no case may a fine exceed \$200 for a speeding violation, \$500 for other Class C offenses; and \$2,000 for certain city ordinance violations. Court costs are assessed if you are found guilty of an offense and must be paid immediately. State law mandates the court costs. The court costs vary according to the offense.
