Tips for a Warmer, More Efficient Home

As the temperature drops, it's important to ensure your home is energy efficient to stay warm and comfortable while reducing your energy bills. Here are some tips to help you save energy and money this winter.

- **Seal up drafts:** Check your windows and doors for drafts and seal them with weatherstripping or caulk.
- **Program your thermostat:** Set your thermostat to a lower temperature at night and when you're away from home. Consider using a programmable thermostat to automate this process.
- **Use energy-efficient appliances:** When replacing appliances, choose energy-efficient models with ENERGY STAR certification.
- **Install LED light bulbs:** LED bulbs use less energy and last longer than traditional incandescent bulbs.
- **Unplug electronics:** Even when turned off, electronics can consume energy. Unplug them when not in use.
- **Maintain your HVAC system:** Regular maintenance, including cleaning and tune-ups, can help your HVAC system operate more efficiently.

Your water consumption from November until March will influence your sewer charges for the entire year. The Winter Quarter Average (WQA)* billing method means you will incur the same monthly fee for wastewater services, calculated based on your average water usage over the winter months.

**WQA is applicable only to residential customers.*

The City of Benbrook invites individuals and groups to participate in the Adopt-a-Mile program and make a positive impact on the community. By adopting a city roadway or park area, you can help keep streets clean and beautiful.

To participate, register online at www.benbrook-tx.gov/216/Trash-Recycling-Environmental. Registered individuals and groups are responsible for organizing clean-up events and requesting supplies from the City, such as trash bags, latex gloves, and reflective vests. Clean-up events can be scheduled monthly, quarterly, or as the area dictates. Together, we can create a cleaner, healthier Benbrook for everyone to enjoy.

Benbrook PD Household Watch Program

The Benbrook Police Department provides a House Watch program that enables residents to notify patrol personnel of short-term absences from their homes. Homeowners complete a House Watch form with basic information regarding the duration of the stay, vehicles, pets, emergency contacts, etc. The information is passed on to officers, who will periodically provide extra patrol during the designated time.

The application is available on the City website, but it must be submitted in person to the Police Department at 1080 Mercedes St.


Christmas Tree Disposal



Weatherizing Your Pool for the Winter

Weatherizing your pool for the winter will help save you thousands of dollars in repairs. It is important to know how your pool equipment operates as weatherization can vary depending on its features. Always call a professional for advice on how to weatherize your specific pool. Here are some basic winter weatherization tips for all pools.

- Clean the surface and structure of the pool.
- Remove and drain equipment when needed.
- Keep the water clean.
- Clean the filter if needed.
- Shock the pool and add appropriate chemicals.
- Maintain the appropriate water level.
- Install a pool cover when possible.
- Keep the filter pump running when the temperature falls below 32 degrees.
